"Language is a fundamental human right. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages are the First Languages of Australia. They are the very essence of our identity, well-being, and knowledge. They are our connection to Country, Cultures and Kinships. Australia has one of the highest rates of language loss in the world. Past colonial policies deliberately broke our connection to languages and therefore cultural and spiritual identity. To this day, policies fail to recognise our languages and to nurture them. Immediate action is required to reverse this loss to allow our languages and our voice to once again thrive and survive."
