#### **First Nations**

Essential but I think we need to recognise that first nations culture is central to first nations life, it's about wellbeing, storytelling, history, family. It's not the same as a western view of art being a tangible collectable permanent thing. It's a completely different world view and is far most whole of government – it almost sits above all else not in alignment with it

#### A Place for Every Story

#### The Centrality of the Artist

The artist is central but not necessarily for art sake. Or rather musicians and actors may not be artists but entertainers. The role of musicians in hospitals for example provides such sustenance to all around them and an income to musicians but it needs incentive and needs some heroes to embrace the possibility.

#### **Strong Institutions**

Not long ago these strong institutions were funded as peak institutions enabling them to train people for the sector – see ABC or Opera Australia. Budget cuts have meant these services have been reduced to al-most nothing – and not full employment just project work.

If you want to rebuild the sector these institutions must provide on the job training/apprenterships.
