First Nations

Pillar 1 I agree with this

Pilar 2. Government support needs to reflect the extra costs to delivering an arts program to remote areas. The cost of travel, accommodation is much higher, the cost of cancelation due to sorry business or community business that takes precedence over the arts project or when the arts project clashes with a football game.

Pillar 3 the concept of Excellence is subjective. An arts outcome that may be considered to be substandard by some may be celebrated widely within the community who developed it and have huge spinoffs because of it.

Pillar 4 For some communities the arts is the only cash providing industry available outside of the usual government pension etc payments

Pillar 5 Digital enabled remote indigenous communities will rely on reliable internet which can be rare especially when a visual artist need to post high resolution photos of work.

Reaching the Audience

All pillars

I live in Broome. We are forced to create site specific and site responsive theatre works if we want our work to be seen by our local audiences. Some of these works have been spectacularly awe-inspiring, Visiting performances are staged in a town hall that is poorly equipped to receive any work that

travels with a large crew or props and scenery. Audience that go beyond 5th row of seating will have sightline issues.

Touring companies stop at the Pilbara as there are no environment-controlled theatres above Port Hedland.

Despite the issues with very poor infrastructure, we continue to bat above our weight in output in theatre works. Sadly, so little of it is seen in our own town. Eg We should travel to Sydney if we want to see a full length production of a Broome work. We have a significant arts collection that is stored in storeroom that is not temperature controlled which leads to significant damage to artworks though mould, insect infestation, and dust.

First Nations

I am a first nations person, a descendant of the stolen generation. I have grown up away from the country off my family. There are so many stories to be told. Traditional public creation stories and cautionary stories. It is also important to preserve the sacred stories in an appropriate way. So much knowledge is being lost as our old people die without passing on those stories. This will lead to a dilution of culture as stories become more modern and influenced by European language media and Arts and cultural traditions.

Story telling is the very core of who we are. It is so important that our stories are told both locally and beyond. They help shape us and help us come to an understanding of who we are. They help build tolerance and general understanding.

Reaching the Audience

This is so difficult to do with no infrastructural support in the form of venues and workplaces, and the increased cost of working in the remote areas.
