The Centrality of the Artist

I believe the only true way to keep the artist central is to support them as an artist, not just as part of a project. An artist wage is the best way to do this, as other countries have demonstrated. This is an investment that will be rewarded.

Strong Institutions

Opportunity: more multiyear funding for smaller independent organisations to assist them to plan into the future and support artists. Support arts training by reversing the funding increases in Universities, ensure major organisations fulfil expectations of diversity and local content. Private institutions (eg schools) have better facilities than local areas – how do we address this infrastructure support issue?
