# **Strong Institutions**

I am an independent playwright, dramaturg and poet, I also teach and mentor and do many things to support my practice. There is a lack of funded institutions to support and nurture artists at different stages of development and those that can support artists over a whole career / lifetime. For example, in Melbourne/Naarm where I live, there are only two well-funded theatre companies and these each put on less than 10 new works by Australian playwrights or writing teams per year. We need a number of mid-sized theatre companies making work that sits outside, between and around the main stages so that more kinds of plays and stories are made and told and a greater range of artists can be supported over many years not just in 1-2 year commissioning processes.
