Cultural Funding by Government — 2017–18

Queensland Government

The estimate of expenditure funded by the Queensland Government in 2017–18 for cultural activities was **\$415.8m**. This represented an increase of 13% or \$48.7m from 2016-17.


- Recurrent expenses accounted for 88% (\$366.5m) of funded cultural expenditure.
- Capital expenditure was \$49.3m, and the largest two categories were *Other museums and cultural heritage* (\$18.7m) and *Performing art venues* (\$14.4m).
- The estimate of per person cultural funding was \$83.78.

Funds on Heritage activities rose 14% (or \$29.2m) to \$241.3m.

This increase was driven by expenditure on the categories of *Libraries* (\uparrow \$16.4m) and *Other museums* and cultural heritage (\uparrow \$8.4m). Increases were offset by a fall in *Archives* (\downarrow \$2.5m).

The largest categories of *Heritage* expenditure were *Libraries* with \$90.8m followed by *Other museums* and cultural heritage with \$75.7m.

Funds for Arts activities rose 13% (or \$19.5m) to \$174.5m.

Three main contributors to this movement were *Performing art venues* $\uparrow 11.7 m, *Radio and television services* $\uparrow 3.8 m and *Multi-arts festivals* $\uparrow 2.7 m. Conversely, funding for *Arts education* dropped \$3.4m.




Figure 2. Queensland Government arts expenditure, by selected categories


Performing arts venues (\$47.3m), accounted for nearly one-third (or 27%) of all funded expenditure by the Queensland Government on *Arts* activities.

Other main categories of Arts activities funding were:

- Arts education—\$35.2m
- Film and video production and distribution—\$19.4m
- Music—\$11.9m
- Visual arts and crafts—\$8.7m
- Multi-arts festivals—\$8.6m.

Recurrent expenditure rose 10% (or \$33.5m) to \$366.5m.

The largest recurrent expenditure was for *Libraries*, \$84.8m, followed by *Other museums and cultural heritage* (\$57.0m).
