Provenance	Presumed originally collected by John Merriman (d. Sept 1834) a collector of "South Seas" material. Acquired by Captain A.W.F. Fuller of London, England on 25 Sept 1928 from T.B. Merriman and Mrs Merriman of Wykeham House, UK. Purchased from Captain Fuller by the Field Museum in 1958. Old label: Necklace, Van Diemen's Land).
